Priest's Tidings

Our world is full of humble, ordinary people living in obscure hamlets, and yet some people like these have changed the course of the world. Within the history of the Church we are shown today the first person coming from such an ordinary milieu who by a simple phrase of her YES turned around the course of the world and the Church to be. It is Mary. Her YES to God, her "Here I am," gave to her and to us Jesus, the Son of God. It made possible the "Here I am, I come to do your will," of Jesus. Her YES and the YES of Jesus call us and the whole Church today to give our unconditional YES to God. Let us ask in this Eucharist that we may join Jesus and Mary in their YES. Then we can change the course of the world today.

To solve our human problems we have recourse to strong means, like authority, influence, money, and power. God's upsetting standards are quite different from ours. To save our world and us he joins people in their weakness and becomes human among us. The Savior is born not in the capital but in a sleepy rural town. He is born in poverty. He overthrows the power of evil with the apparent weakness of humility, obedience, and service. A woman and a child are at the beginning of our salvation. Let us recognize God's astonishing way of coming.

Hear the The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew
1:18-24

Glory to you, O Lord.

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel' which means, God with us. When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife.

Prayer and Meditation

Lectio:

Matthew presents Jesus as the fulfilment of God's promises, tracing his lineage back to Abraham and David. While Luke focuses on Mary's encounter with the angel, Matthew highlights Joseph's dream, in which an angel assures him that Mary's child is from the Holy Spirit. Joseph obediently accepts Mary as his wife and names the child Jesus, meaning "the Lord saves." By doing so, Joseph gives Jesus legal descent from King David. Together, Mary and Joseph faithfully take part in God's plan of salvation, preparing the way for Jesus' mission.

Meditatio:

- Think about Joseph. How must he have felt when Mary told him an angel had told her she would be the mother of God's son? Or that she was pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit?
- What lessons can you learn from Joseph's willingness to act quickly when he knew what God wanted him to do?
- Jesus came to save people from their sins. What does this mean for you?
- God gives grace and strength to face impossible situations. When and where has He helped you?

Oratio:

God promised to send a Messiah to save His people. Think about His faithfulness. Marvel that Jesus came to earth as Emmanuel, "God with us." What does this mean for you?
